Local Development Strategy

The Swifts Creek Future Local Development Strategy (LDS) has been approved by the Leadership Group!

What is the LDS?-the Strategy is an outline of the project and a guide for the project for the remainder of the project until December 2026. How was it developed?- The Strategy has been a work in progress since the commencement of the initial funding in November 2022, the final outcome was reached through significant community consultation, workshopping and investigation of identified opportunities and establishment of Leadership and Working Groups.

What happens now? - Each Innovation Working Group and Leadership Group, in collaboration with East Gippsland Shire Council, Department of Education, Energy and Climate Action (DEECA) and other stakeholders will work toward each of the identified areas for opportunity.

Nature-Based Recreation and Tourism

The project team is currently working with East Gippsland Shire Council on opportunities linked to the Swifts Creek Master Realm Planning. A key focus is the revitalisation of local trail maps, with new branding being developed in collaboration with EGSC and Destination Gippsland. In addition, historic trails are being mapped and adapted for new walking, horse riding, and cycling experiences. Opportunities for additional trail developments and partnerships are also being actively explored, alongside investigations into improved trail signage.

Support is also being sought for the development of a static display of the Crossley Engine in Ensay, which would serve as a unique heritage tourism

feature for the region.

Unfortunately, due to recent changes in project staffing, the application for Round 2 of the Community Development Fund (CDF) was not submitted in time. As a result, funding to support the investigation and development of a collaborative farming structure tailored to the region was not secured in this round.

A submission will be prepared for Round 3 of the CDF to progress this important initiative. In the meantime, potential opportunities for collaboration with local businesses and the Gippsland Agriculture Group (GAgG) are being actively discussed and explored to help strengthen the project and its long-term impact.

Education and Skills

A report on the feasibility investigation into the potential development of a Live and Learn facility for the region has been received. The working group is currently analysing the findings to determine the most viable options for moving forward.

Meanwhile, the "This is Swifts Creek" picture book pilot program is progressing well. A focus group has been established, and implementation planning is underway. The group is aiming for a successful launch of the book in Swifts Creek in December 2025. This pilot project is designed to foster a multi-faceted learning and networking opportunity for the community, celebrating local identity while supporting educational and social outcomes.
