- Omeo Tourism Ecosystem Mapping Report This report sets out strategies to grow tourism by leveraging Omeo's strengths in heritage, natural
  landscapes, and outdoor recreation. It identifies opportunities for new accommodation, infrastructure, and partnerships to better support visitors
  and businesses.
- Justice Precinct Draft Masterplan This plan explores how the historic Justice Precinct and surrounding civic spaces can be revitalised as a cultural
  anchor for the town. It proposes ways to restore heritage assets, improve visitor experiences, and integrate nearby Council-owned facilities such as
  the Service Centre, depot, and mountain bike office. Together, these projects aim to position the Precinct as a catalyst for economic activity and
  tourism growth.

### **Swifts Creek and Omeo Structure plan**

Consultants, together with East Gippsland Shire Council staff, have met and undertaken site visits in both Omeo and Swifts Creek to gain a better understanding of the layout, character, and needs of the towns. Community engagement has already commenced, with further consultation and engagement activities planned for October.

Key aspects considered by a Structure Plan include existing and proposed land zoning and overlays, land supply needs (for various uses including housing), public realm opportunities and the consideration of constraints such as bushfire and flood. Each town will get its own Structure Plan and specifically for Swifts Creek, consultants will be engaged to investigate wastewater treatment options for Swifts Creek to support the town's long-term planning.

#### Value-add Primary Industry

Did you know Agriculture is our biggest industry? Data from 2022 shows Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing contributing to over half our regions exports with a value of over \$32million and was also the areas highest employer with 105 jobs. This is one of the reasons Agriculture is one of our most valuable industries in our region. So how can this industry increase value to our community? Join our working group and let's talk about it! Create connection and networking with community, government, industry and academics to drive innovation and change for Agriculture in our area. #### **Nature based recreation & Tourism**

Our working group has been focusing on opportunities to improve signage in our area while sharing the stories and history of the area. A proposal is being developed to incorporate signage and story-telling into a project for supporting and promoting visitation. Some members of the group are also part of the Crossley Engine Restoration Project working group who have been working on establishing the Crossley Engine static display in Ensay, the group is seeking investment and funding to support the infrastructure of the site.

## **Meat Processing Facility**

On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> August, local producers, game harvesters, investors, East Gippsland Shire Council and DEECA met to discuss if there is potential for a meat processing facility and/or abattoir to be located in Swifts Creek or area.

The discussion confirmed that a new meat processing facility in Swifts Creek is not required, as existing infrastructure in Bairnsdale and Orbost adequately meets current needs. Instead, opportunities lie in developing value-added production, such as jerky or dried protein, which could create jobs and open new markets. A shared 'further meat processing facility', similar to a commercial kitchen facility, was identified as a potential community asset, provided its scope, compliance requirements, and market opportunities are clearly defined.

Further investigation has shown that establishing such a facility would only be viable if supported by a secure and established market. Given that current services are already meeting demand—and have the capacity to expand if required—there is little evidence to suggest the need for a new facility in the region at this time. However, as part of the upcoming study into models for collaborative farming, this opportunity could be revisited to assess its potential for inclusion in a future model.
